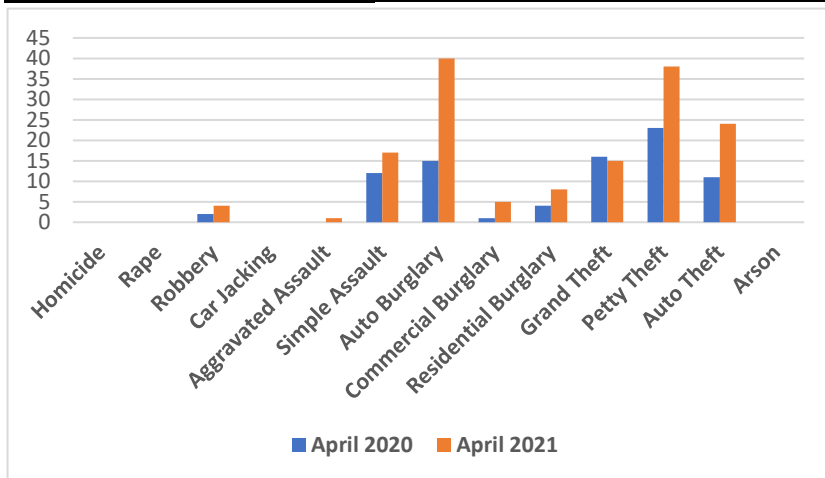

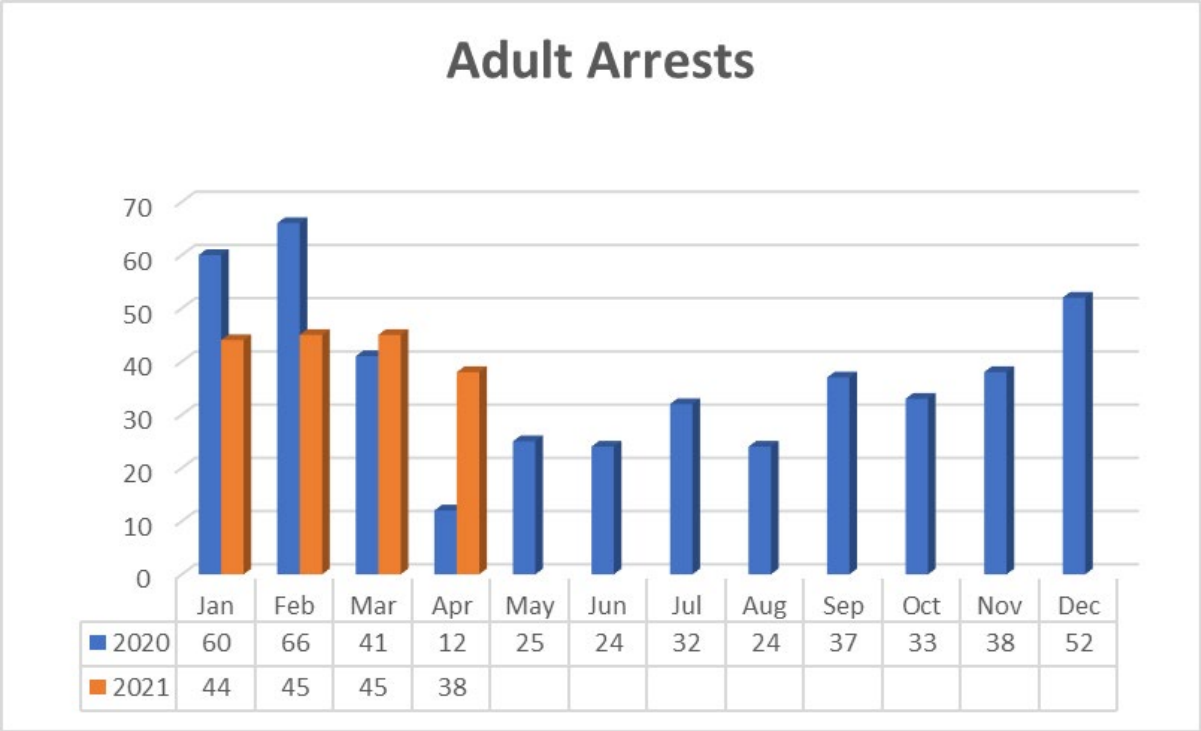

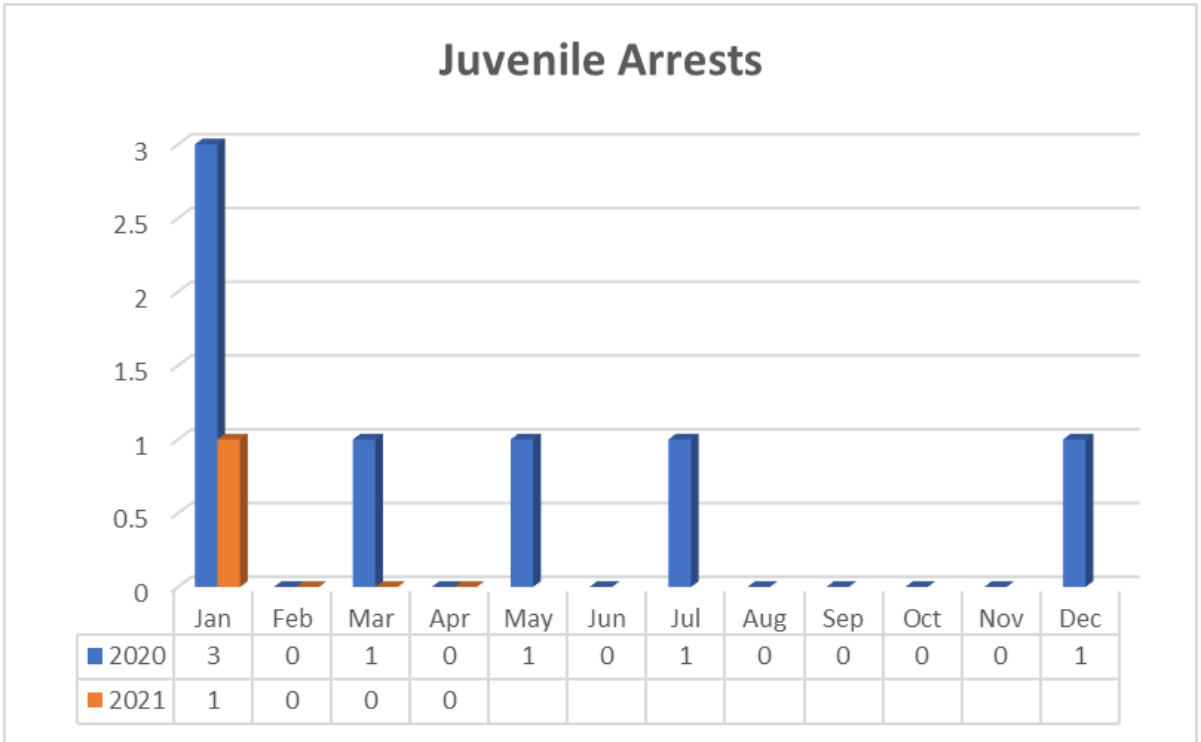
Adult and Juvenile Arrests

Robbery: In District 5 at Banana Republic, 5791 Christie Ave., two female shoplifters selected and concealed merchandise in bags and exited the store without paying. One of the suspects discharged a taser upon exiting the store. SUSPECTS: #1 Female, late 20s - early 30s, 5'6", 220 lbs., wearing a light-colored top, dark jeans, and armed with a taser. #2 Female, 6'0", 250-280 lbs., wearing colorful clothing. SUSPECT VEHICLE: Honda Civic, 4-Door, White. LOSS: \$3000 in store merchandise. **At Ross Dress for Less, 5733 Christie Ave.,** a female shoplifter threatened to cut a store employee and fled the scene with store merchandise. SUSPECT: Female, 50s, short hair, wearing dark clothing. LOSS: \$300 in merchandise. **In District 8 at 7-Eleven, 4000 San Pablo Ave.,** male shoplifter concealed merchandise in his pocket. The store employee asked the shoplifter to return the merchandise. However, the shoplifter pushed the store employee and exited the store. Seconds later, the suspect returned with a knife in his hand and threatened to kill the store employee. The suspect slashed the knife at the store employee but did not make contact. The suspect fled the area. SUSPECT: Male, no further description. LOSS: \$2.99 in merchandise. **In District 9 at Home Depot, 3838 Hollis St.,** a male shoplifter stole merchandise outside of the garden area. Upon contact by loss prevention agents and security, the shoplifter brandished a firearm. Shortly thereafter a loss prevention agent convinced the shoplifter to return the merchandise. The shoplifter returned the merchandise, put the firearm away in his pocket, and left the area.

Aggravated Assault: In District 8 at ECAP, 3610 San Pablo Ave., a physical altercation between two males resulted in one male being pepper sprayed and the other male being punched in the face. EPD cited and released both individuals.

Commercial Burglary: In District 2 at Kimono My House, 1455 64th St., POE: Bathroom window – Forced open. LOSS: Collectable figurines. **In District 3 at Ayar Labs, 5909 Christie Ave.,** POE: Door. LOSS: Computer boards and computer equipment. **In District 7 at Wing Stop, 4133 San Pablo Ave.,** POE: Lower storefront window – kicked/smashed. The suspect targeted the cash register. The suspect opened the register and was frightened off by the alarm. LOSS: None. **In District 7 at 1100 47th St.; ECCL High School,** POE: Gate. LOSS: None. EPD arrested two suspects shortly thereafter. **In District 9 at GameStop, 3980 Hollis St.,** POE: Front door window – Smashed. Approximately (20) vehicles were seen driving through the parking lot towards GameStop. Several suspects exited their vehicles, burglarized the store, and fled the area. EPD arrested one young male adult.
